In addition, through this beneficial project individuals served by UCP Seguin receive special podiatric treatment, enabling them to be more mobile, and to actively engage their world.

This year the Community Memorial Foundation has issued UCP Seguin a challenge – a grant to cover costs of vision and podiatric care for people with developmental disabilities.
